#### PENNSYLVANIA MIGRATION COUNT BY BRUCE CARL

Lancaster County participated again this year in the Pennsylvania Migration Count (PAMC) that was held on Saturday, May 12, 2012. The 44 participants identified 151 species for the day; highlights included one Dickcissal, 19 Brant, 1 Gray-cheeked Thrush, and 3 Goldeneye.

There were 11 species of raptors identified, including both Black and Turkey Vultures, one Northern Harrier, 22 Bald Eagles, and two Peregrine Falcons. Eight species of shorebirds were present that included 27 Semipalmated Plovers, 43 Solitary Sandpipers, and 486 Least Sandpipers.

Participants found warblers to be well represented with 29 species identified. Highlights included Tennessee, Cape May, Yellow-throated, Bay-breasted, Cerulean, Prothonotary, Kentucky, Wilson's and Yellow-breasted Chat.

Some other notable species included three-Common Mergansers, three Common Loon, one Common Tern, one Caspian Tern, one Black-billed Cuckoo, one Common Nighthawk, two Red-headed Woodpeckers, two Ruby-crowned Kinglets, one Swainson's Thrush, and three Blue-headed Grosbeak.

### CONEJOHELA FLATS SHOREBIRD SURVEY REPORT BY JERRY BOOK

Shorebird numbers have continued to plummet in the last three years. Safe Harbor has raised the top elevation over the last few years from 227.2 to 227.6 feet based on their spring surveys of mudflat buildup. As long as they measure 1.3 acres of mudflat resting habitat at top elevation and 6.3 acres of feeding habitat at lower elevations, they can increase the top elevation. From 2006 until 2010 the actual survey counts averaged 7,592 shorebirds. In 2011 it dropped to 3035 and in 2012 it was 3447. The spring count for 2013 looks rather dismal. If the 2013 fall count is down then a three year trend of well below normal counts may signal a habitat problem. It seems to me, and others familiar with the Conejohela Flats, that the quantity of feeding habitat during daylight hours has been reduced. Perhaps the Safe Harbor generation schedule has changed so that the good feeding habitat is available for fewer hours during the day, or the habitat is more available at night than during daylight. It is also possible the quality of the habitat has changed. We'll need to keep a close eye on this and react accordingly.

The top shorebirds for 2012 were Upland Sandpiper (Bob Schutsky-2<sup>nd</sup> Flats record) and Piping Plover (Chuck Chalfant). Red Phalarope, Red-necked Phalarope, Hudsonian Godwit and American Avocet were noteworthy.

The top birding event of the year, perhaps in the last fifty years, was produced by Hurricane Sandy. From dawn to dusk a steady stream of displaced ocean/coastal/migrant birds was following the Susquehanna River corridor to return to their preferred destination. The dozen birders that focused on the Flats upriver to Marietta were kept busy all day recording and enjoying the parade of birds. It's noteworthy that excellent coverage near Harrisburg and the Conowingo Pond produced a different mix of birds than did the Flats and Marietta. For instance no Jaegers were recorded at the Flats/Marietta while they were tallied in large numbers in Harrisburg and a few were seen at the Conowingo Pond. Some of the birds seen during Hurricane Sandy at the Conejohela Flats upriver to Marietta on 10/30/2012 and the days following are listed below.

## SOUTHERN LANCASTER COUNTY CHRISTMAS BIRD COUNT BY BOB SCHUTSKY

The Southern Lancaster County Christmas Bird Count (SoLanco CBC) was held on Sunday, December 16, 2012. The weather was cloudy to partly cloudy with temperatures in the mid 40's. The 52 participants logged 162 hours of effort and identified 115 species for the day. Rare bird reports were required for five species that included: Northern Shrike, four Common Ravens, two Wilson's Warblers, 11 White-winged Crossbills and two Common Redpolls. Other highlights included: three Cackling Geese, six Common Goldeneye, 35 Bald Eagles, six Red-Shouldered Hawks, four Merlin, one Peregrine Falcon, one Lesser-Black-backed Gull, one Barn Owl, four Long-eared Owls, and two Snow Buntings.

## LITITZ CHRISTMAS BIRD COUNT BY BRUCE CARL

The Lititz Christmas Bird Count was held on Sunday, December 30, 2012. The 48 participants identified 95 species for the day plus three count week species\*\* that included Great Egret, Peregrine Falcon, and Common Redpoll. Highlights of the count included: four Cackling Geese, two Wood Ducks, 145 Northern Shovelers, 16 Bald Eagles, nine Northern Harriers 11 Wild Turkeys, 13 Wilson's Snipe, one Great Blackbacked Gull, three Long-eared Owls, five Short-eared Owls, two Rufous Hummingbirds, two Common Ravens, 23 Red-breasted Nuthatches, five Ruby-crowned Kinglets, seven Hermit Thrush, seven Cedar Waxwings, one Gray Catbird, four Fox Sparrows, one Chipping Sparrow, two Purple Finches, three Pine Siskins, and seven White-winged Crossbills.

### LANCASTER CHRISTMAS BIRD COUNT BY BARBARA HUNSBERGER

The Lancaster Christmas Bird Count was held on Saturday, January 5, 2013. The weather was light rain in the morning and clear in the afternoon with temperatures averaging in the mid-thirties. The 61 participants logged 109.15 hours of effort and identified 105 species for the day. Highlights of the day included: one Wood Duck, one Northern Pintail, one Long-tailed Duck, three Horned Grebes, 27 Bald Eagles, one Lesser Black-backed Gull, one Glaucous Gull, two Barred Owls, one Hermit Thrush, one Rusty Blackbird, one Common Redpoll and six Pine Siskins.

#### LANCASTER COUNTY YEAR LIST BY BRUCE A CARL

Lancaster County continues to be a very rewarding experience for local birders and for those birders visiting this area. The year 2012 produced a record tying 284 species identified, with three new species added to the composite list, which was first started back in 1977 and now stands at 345. There were also 284 species identified back in 2007. The new species added for 2012 are listed below:

<u>Bewick's Wren</u> – A single bird was located along the Canal Path Trail just south of the Falmouth River Access area on 5/2 and then again on 5/3.

<u>Wilson's Storm Petrel</u> - A single bird of this species was identified along the Susquehanna River during Hurricane Sandy on 10/30.

<u>Calliope Hummingbird</u> - This Lancaster County first record was first found on 11/16, was banded on 12/1, and remained until 12/11.

There was a total of nine different hummingbirds identified during the fall of 2012 in Lancaster County with five of them that were able to be banded. These included the following: one (banded) Calliope, four (banded) Rufous and four (not banded) Selephorus Species.

During the day of October 30, 2012 and the few days following, Hurricane Sandy traveled through Lancaster County with an amazing number of rare birds found during this event, mainly along the Susquehanna River. Some of the more interesting species found during Hurricane Sandy included: Leach's Storm Petrel, Wilson's Storm Petrel, Red Phalarope, Black Skimmer, Pomarine Jaeger, Parasitic Jaeger, Laughing Gull, Cave Swallow, Brant, Surf Scoter, Black Scoter, White-winged Scoter, Black-bellied Plover, American Golden Plover, Dunlin, Greater Yellowlegs and Lesser Yellowlegs.

### Some other notable Highlights for 2012:

<u>Black-bellied Whistling Ducks</u> - There were two birds found and photographed at Middle Creek WMA on 7/26 and were most likely escaped birds from a local taxidermist.

<u>Swainson's Warbler</u> - A single bird was found near Octoraro Lake during the afternoon of 5/11. It was first heard and then later seen briefly.

**Piping Plover** - On 9/6 a single bird was located on the Susquehanna River's Conejohela Flats.

<u>Franklin's Gull</u> - One individual was found among the 100+ Ring-billed Gulls located on the Susquehanna River's Conejohela Flats on 9/23.

<u>Painted Bunting</u> - The hatch-year male that was found on 12/31/11 near Washington Boro remained in the area until late January 2012.

**<u>King Rail</u>** - This species was found at two different locations during 2012 with the first bird found at Wood's Edge Pond on 3/9 and the second bird found at Middle Creek WMA on 6/2.

Black-necked Stilt - On 5/22 a single bird was found at the Conewago Trail Wetlands Area.

<u>Eared Grebe</u> - A probable sighting of this species was observed on 3/20 on the Susquehanna River near Long Level.

Mississippi Kite - There was one and possibly a second bird seen near Speedwell Lake on 4/22.

Thanks to all who have contributed to this list this year and in years past. Without your sightings, this list and report would not be possible. This will be my final report for the Year List after 20 years of compiling this information for the county. Where has the time gone? It seems that it was not too long ago (1993) that I took over from Bob Schutsky to continue this list, which he began back in 1977. Mike Epler has volunteered to continue keeping this yearly list up to date starting in 2013. Please keep your sightings coming.
